

The UNHCR is committed to playing its role in saving lives and maintaining the rights of all refugees. The History of The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees began in 1950 when many Europeans were displaced by the impact of the Second World War. Millions of people were forced to leave their homes while others lost theirs altogether. The office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees played a large role in assisting the refugees for three years, which is essentially why the UNHCR was created.

The organization continued its work by helping to resettle Hungarian refugees that were forced to leave their homes in 1956 during the time of the Hungarian Revolution. Making their way to Austria, they were identified to be asylum seekers. The UNHCR's efforts are what helped create the best response for alternative organizations when dealing with the refugee crisis' in the future. The UNHCR has put in over seventy years of work, aiding over fifty million refugees. The organization's immense efforts are what have given refugees a chance at better lives.

## **Topic 1: Empowering Refugees Through Technology**

Technology can be an empowering source to help refugees in many different ways. It allows people to become more self-sufficient and informed. Regardless of this fact, according to the UNHCR, "refugees are still 50 percent less likely than the general population to have an internet-capable phone, and 29 percent do not own a phone at all" (UNHCR, 2020). The real challenge that refugees face is the overall connectivity cost as "refugees often spend up to a third of their disposable income on staying connected" (UNHCR 2020)

Refugees.


#### EMPOWERING REFUGEES THROUGH TECHNOLOGY

Technology has the power to change refugees' lives all across the world. Technology provides refugees with the tools that can tackle the challenges of having an online platform in which asylum seekers and refugees are given the opportunity to reach services from the governments and organizations like UNHCR's websites. Furthermore, staying connected with relatives who could potentially help them throughout the process and giving them proper directions by using applications such as maps, keeping necessary documentation on their cell phones. Accessing financial services such as cash assistance and knowledge to find job placement can be helpful tools as well. Lastly, the ability to have a digital identity and accessibility to online education, especially during COVID-19 can influence the empowerment of refugees with technological tools.





By having access to technology, refugees are able to get a quality education online. In 2020-2021, we have been overpowered by a pandemic that has taken 90 percent of students out of school. Technology provides an alternative for refugees who are unable to attend school. This directly affects SDG 4 quality education and its specific target universal literacy and numeracy. Universal literacy and numeracy are more achievable when access to online education is continuously more attainable for both adults and children who can be taught to read, write and complete basic numerical concepts.





When given online access through technology, simple things such as finding jobs are more reachable to those that need it most. This works towards SDG 8 decent work and economic growth, and its specific target substantially reduces the proportion of youth not in employment, education or training. When refugees can search for jobs, schooling or training for themselves and/or their family members, they have more access to more opportunities. Overall this can have an immense impact on the amount of youth and adults that are employed, enrolled in an education etc.

## FURTHER QUESTIONS FOR DELEGATES TO CONSIDER

- 1. How can refugees have access to technology before they migrate?
- 2. How can technology be cost-effective yet adequate at the same time?
- 3. With which internet providers and how will partnerships be formed so refugees can have more affordable and accessible internet?

Focusing on the empowerment of refugees through technology helps both individualism of refugees and helps the country guesting with them. When refugees attain technology, so many more tools are easily accessible to them, which can overall help to tackle several sustainable development goals.
